

# Official Invitation NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP 2024/25

To: The Principals of All Secondary Level Educational Institutions in Jamaica.

The Jamaica Chess Federation (JCF) invites all secondary level schools in Jamaica, to participate in the National High Schools Chess Championships 2024/2025.

The Preliminaries will take the form of a two-day zonal round robin or Swiss event. Friday, January 31st, 2025 will see the staging of a one-day playoff for teams that finished second and third in the Preliminaries. The twenty (20) best teams in the country will come together on Thursday, February 27th and Friday, February 28th, 2025 for a two-day six-round final.

### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

In order to enter one or more teams (maximum four teams per school), each school must submit the following to the Jamaica Chess Federation:

- 1. Name of School Team (e.g. School A, B etc), names of players, board order of players, date of birth for each player and contact number to jamchessfed.junior.chess@gmail.com . You Must Use Entry form attached.
- 2. Entry fee of J\$5,000 for each team being entered.
- 3. JCF membership fee of J\$15,000 per annum. Schools that have already paid the membership fee, or whose team members are currently members of the JCF, will only be required to pay the entry fee at two (2) above.

All team details should be emailed to jamchessfed.junior.chess@gmail.com no later than November 8, 2024. Entry fees, and membership fees are to be completed at any BNS Branch or directly transferred to the Jamaica Chess Federation, BNS New Kingston, Current Account# 010315516, Branch code # 50575, no later than November 29, 2024.

Please note that teams are not required to bring sets. The JCF will provide adequate numbers of sets and clocks for the Preliminaries, Playoffs and the Finals.

We extend our best wishes to all schools participating across the island in this year's chess championship, encouraging not only competitive excellence but also the highest standards of sportsmanship and a deep appreciation for the game of chess.

# FORMAT

### PRELIMINARY ZONES

Preliminary Zones will be established for all teams which includes:

- 1. Kingston & St Andrew
- 2. Western
- 3. North Eastern
- 4. Middlesex

The winner of each Zone will move automatically to the finals, while the second and third place teams will advance to a playoff tournament, where they will compete to qualify for the finals. **NB.** In the event that a zone does not contain enough teams/too many teams then zones may be merged/split or the number of teams qualifying for the playoffs may increase or decrease.

### PLAYOFFS

The Playoffs will be comprised of the second and third place teams finishers from the respective prelimary zones where they will compete to qualify for the finals.

### FINALS

The Finals will be comprised of the top twenty (20) teams qualifying islands from the prelimanary zones and play offs.

# PRIZES

Prizes, trophies and medals will be awarded to the top five teams from the finals. Medals and trophies will be awarded to the top players on boards one to four, the top reserve player, the overall winners of each combined preliminary zones and the top female team.



# RULES AND REGULATIONS

### Tie Breaks

If the two or more teams score the same number of match points, the tie shall be broken as follows:

- a. Total number of gamepoints.
- b. Sonneborn-Berger (Matchpoints).
- c. Sonneborn-Berger (Gamepoints).
- d. Berlin System: win on Board 1 4 points; win on Board 2 3 points; win on Board 3 -
- 2 points; win on Board 4 1 point. In case of drawn games, the points are shared.

# **Technical Regulations**

- a. Teams shall be made up of four main players and up to two reserves.
- b. Each team shall have a captain, who may also be one of the main players or reserves. Each team's definite fixed board order shall be confirmed upon submission.
- c. There is no requirement to assign board numbers in rating order.
- d. Each player shall be assigned a number from 1 to 6. This creates a board order, which cannot be changed and remains fixed throughout the tournament.

# Appeals Committee

- The president of the appeals committee will be the Chief Arbiter or Tournament Director.
- 2. It will be made up of three (3) holders and two (2) substitutes.
- 3.All protests shall be submitted in writing by a team captain to the Appeals Committee **not more than 15 minutes** after the relevant playing session, or the particular infringement complained against.
- 4. Each protest shall be accompanied by a deposit fee of **five thousand (5000)**Jamaican dollars or the equivalent in local currency. If the protest is accepted, the fee shall be returned. If the protest is rejected, the fee may be forfeited to FIDE upon a decision of the Chairman of the Appeals Committee.
- 5. The Committee may decide on the following matters:
- Appeal against a decision by an arbiter
- Any appeal which the Appeal Committee considers relevant.
- 6.The Appeal Committee shall endeavour to find binding solutions that are within FIDE legal framework and the true spirit of the FIDE motto, Gens Una Sumus.
- 7. The written decision of the Appeals Committee arising from any dispute in respect of these regulations shall be final.







### **Default Time**

In case a player arrives at the chessboard with a delay of up to 25 minutes from the actual start of the game, he/she will lose the game, unless the Chief Arbiter decides that the delay was due to an event of force majeure.

# Fair Play

Fair Play measures will be applied in accordance with the FIDE Anti-Doping Guidelines. With the sole exception of play recording equipment, during a game players and captains are prohibited from having on the playing field any electronic device that has not been specifically approved by the referee. Companions or spectators are prohibited from using electronic devices on the pitch, except for taking pictures when explicitly approved by the referee.

## Individual Board Award

Players assigned to the same board number in their respective team lists compete for individual board awards namely: gold trophy. The board trophies shall be awarded according to most points accummilated, except if more than one player is tied then the player of the higher ranking team is granted the award.
